

SPEAKER BIOS

Hon. Jerome B. Abrams JAMS

Judge Abrams joined JAMS in Minneapolis after a distinguished 14year career as a Minnesota district court judge and 27 years as a successful lawyer with a national practice based in Minneapolis. His experience as a trial lawyer and judge has given him unique insights and allow him to serve as a neutral in all types of cases. He has also received training and served as an ADR neutral under Minnesota rules.



As a judge, Judge Abrams was appointed to many of the most complicated and high-profile cases in Minnesota state courts, including many multidistrict assignments. These cases have involved hundreds of mechanic's liens in failed housing developments and high-rises, construction defects resulting in tens of millions of dollars in claimed damages and complicated environmental cases concerning the regulation of solid waste landfills.

As a lawyer, Judge Abrams served as National Counsel for a mid-sized property and casualty insurer handling claims and coverage, as well as significant policyholder litigation. He was Counsel for many foreign insurers in the London Market and elsewhere dealing with multiyear, multi-layer complex cases. He tried as lead counsel some of the largest and most contentious coverage litigation actually taken to trial.

As a national leader for the improvement of civil justice, complex case management, court technology and e-discovery, Judge Abrams has presented on over 100 occasions to groups in the U.S. and abroad on these and related subjects. He continues to author texts on insurance coverage for business torts and e-discovery, and he wrote a bench book for business courts published by the American Bar Association. He is an Honorary Fellow in The American College of Coverage Counsel and a member of the National Board of the American Board of Trial Advocates.



Professor Daniel Schwarcz

University of Minnesota Law School

Professor Schwarcz is an award-winning teacher and scholar. His research principally focuses on insurance law and regulation, spanning a broad range of issues such as systemic risk, regulatory federalism, health insurance, and coverage litigation. A separate strand of Schwarcz's research explores the impact of Artificial Intelligence on legal education, the practice of law, and consumer protection.



Schwarcz's scholarship has received numerous accolades. In 2017, the American Law Institute awarded Schwarcz its highly selective Early Career Scholars Medal, which recognizes "outstanding law professors whose work is relevant to public policy and has the potential to influence improvements in the law relevant to the real world." Schwarcz has also been awarded the Liberty Mutual Prize for penning an outstanding insurance law article and been recognized as one of the most cited legal scholars writing on tort or insurance topics.

Schwarcz's scholarship has been published in a wide range of leading law reviews and journals, including the University of Chicago Law Review, Virginia Law Review, UCLA Law Review, Southern California Law Review and Journal of Empirical Legal Studies. He is also a co-author of the leading insurance law casebook in the country, Insurance Law and Regulation (7th edition 2020) which has been used as the principal text in courses on insurance law in more than 100 American law schools. Media outlets such as the New York Times, Wall Street Journal, and National Public Radio have covered Schwarcz's scholarship. He has testified to U.S. Congressional committees on more than a half-dozen occasions and regularly serves as an expert witness in insurance-oriented disputes.

Schwarcz has won the University of Minnesota Law School's Stanley V. Kinyon teaching award on three separate occasions since joining the law school, most recently in 2023. In 2024, Schwarcz received the University of Minnesota's Award for Outstanding Contributions to Graduate and Professional Education. He teaches a broad range of classes at the law school, including torts, contracts, insurance law,
